Course Description

This is a fun course to learn the basics of American Sign Language. The emphasis is to build a usable sign language vocabulary and beginners level ASL structure. Additionally, students will develop appropriate grammar through expressive and receptive signing skills. Handouts and other online resources we will provide. Please note, our classes are hands-on and activity focused. Students will receive homework assignments to help them retain the information they learn during class.

Tip: Which hand to use when signing? The answer is, your dominate hand. If you are right handed, your right hand will do all the moving, and if your left handed your left hand does the moving. The non-dominate hand is a bit more stationary but it gets a bit of a workout too!
